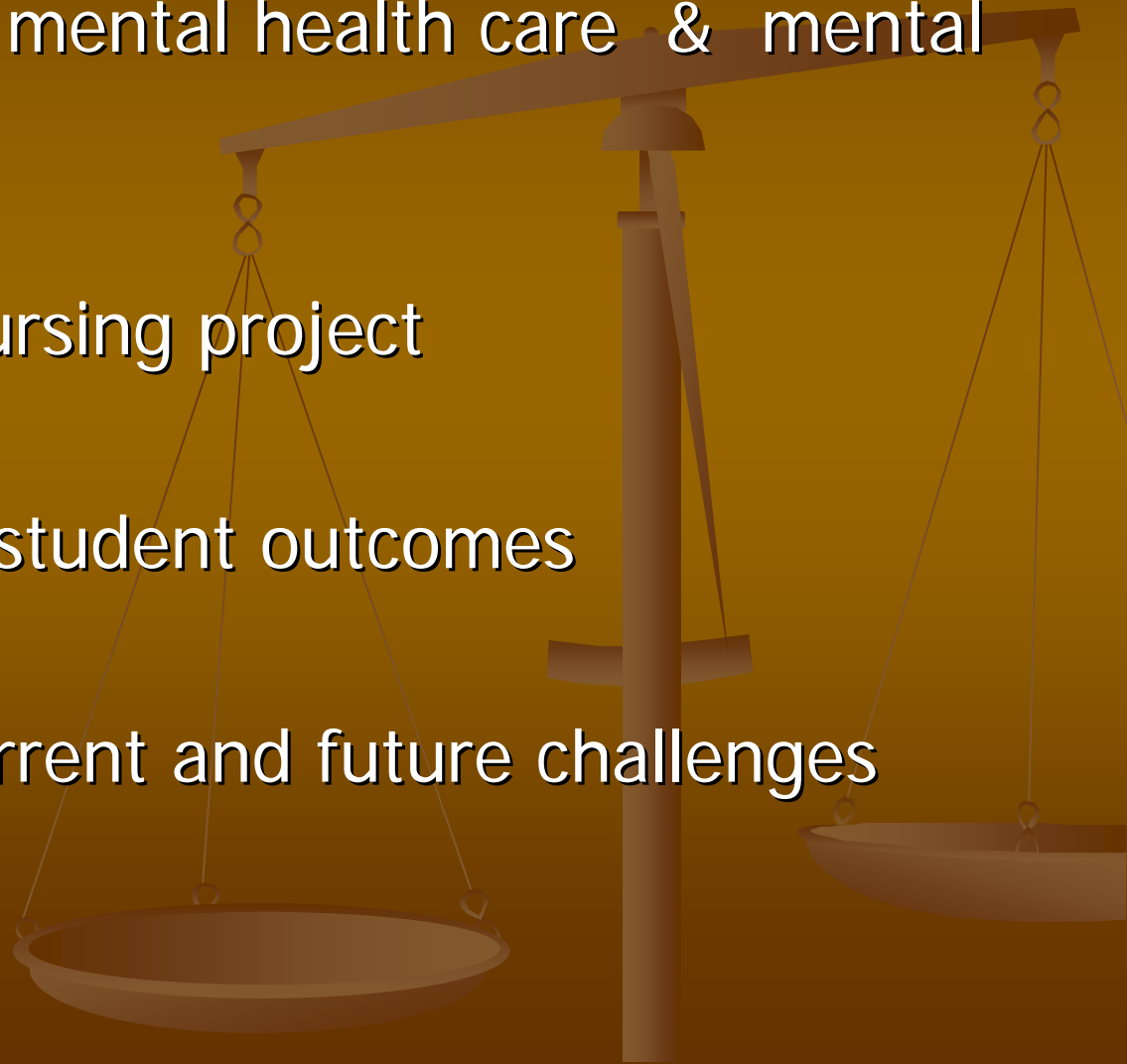

Mental Health Care Guyana



Inadequate in number & training to meet the mental health needs of the pop.

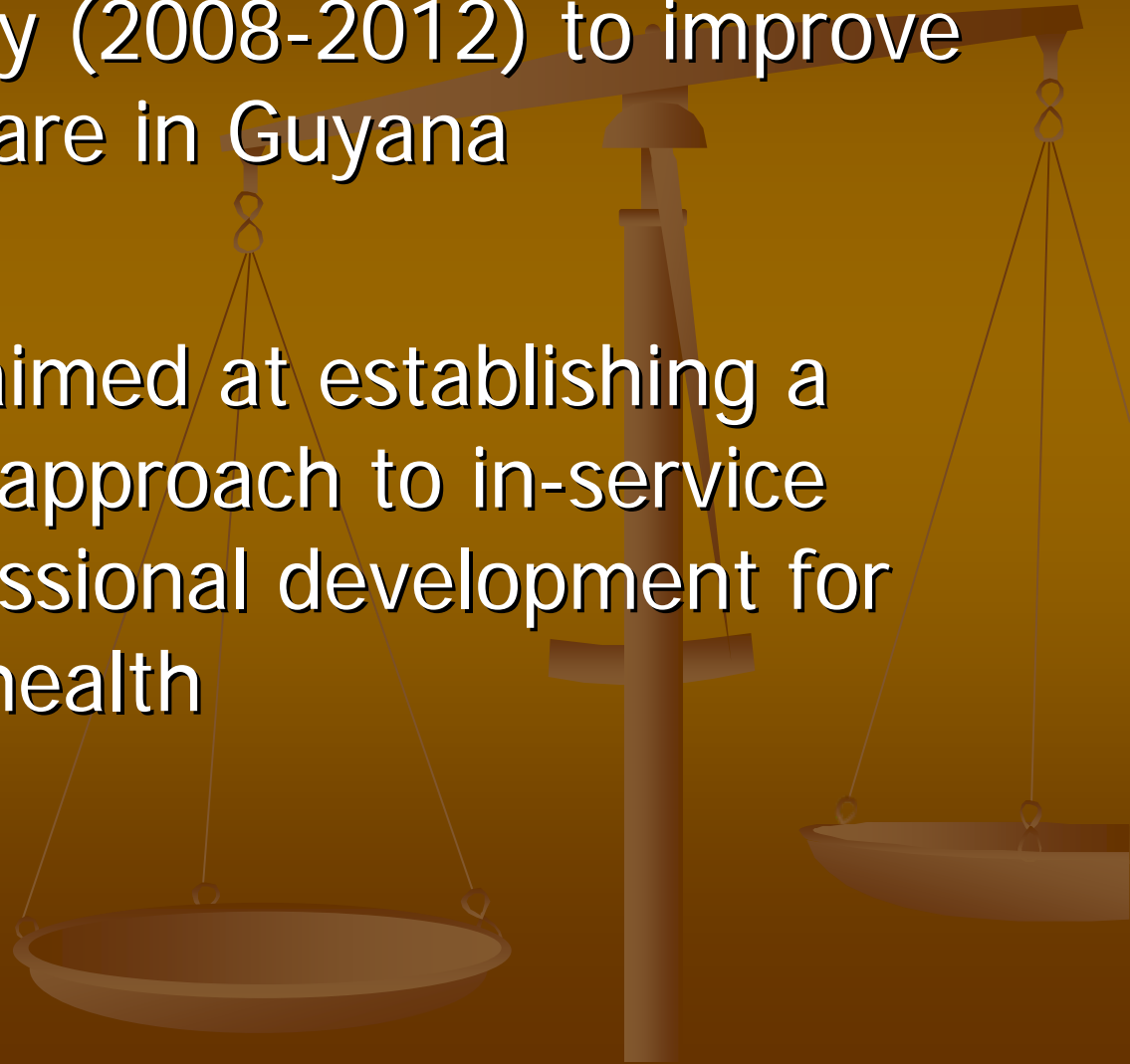
No psychiatric nurses in the country in either the public or private sector

Care in psychiatric settings barely meets basis care needs

Mental Health Strategy-Guyana

Multi-year strategy (2008-2012) to improve mental health care in Guyana

Strategies 6 & 7 aimed at establishing a comprehensive approach to in-service training & professional development for health & allied health



Purpose of the Nursing Involvement



Develop a post-RN program in psychiatric nursing to ↑ human resource capacity

Implement & evaluate the education program and delivery model

Work collaboratively with the Ministry of Health to create a sustainability plan

Current Status



Program model

30 week self-study program, supported through Elluminate, & followed by 4-mo. internship

Periodic on-site clinical supervision, evaluation/testing and problem solving

Update on the students progress

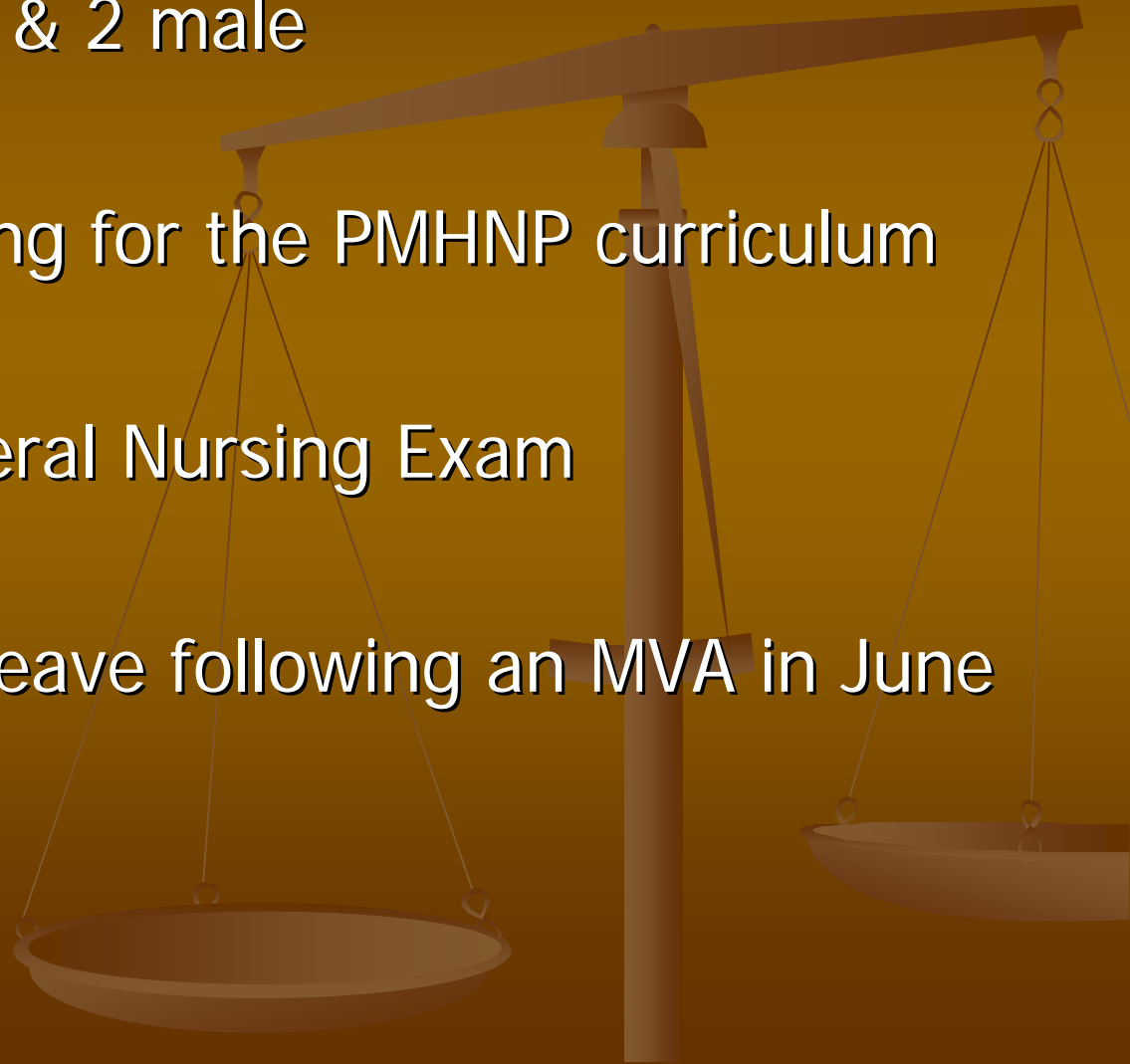
Current Status-Cont'd

8 students-6 female & 2 male

5/8 passed the testing for the PMHNP curriculum

2/5 passed the General Nursing Exam

1/8 out on medical leave following an MVA in June

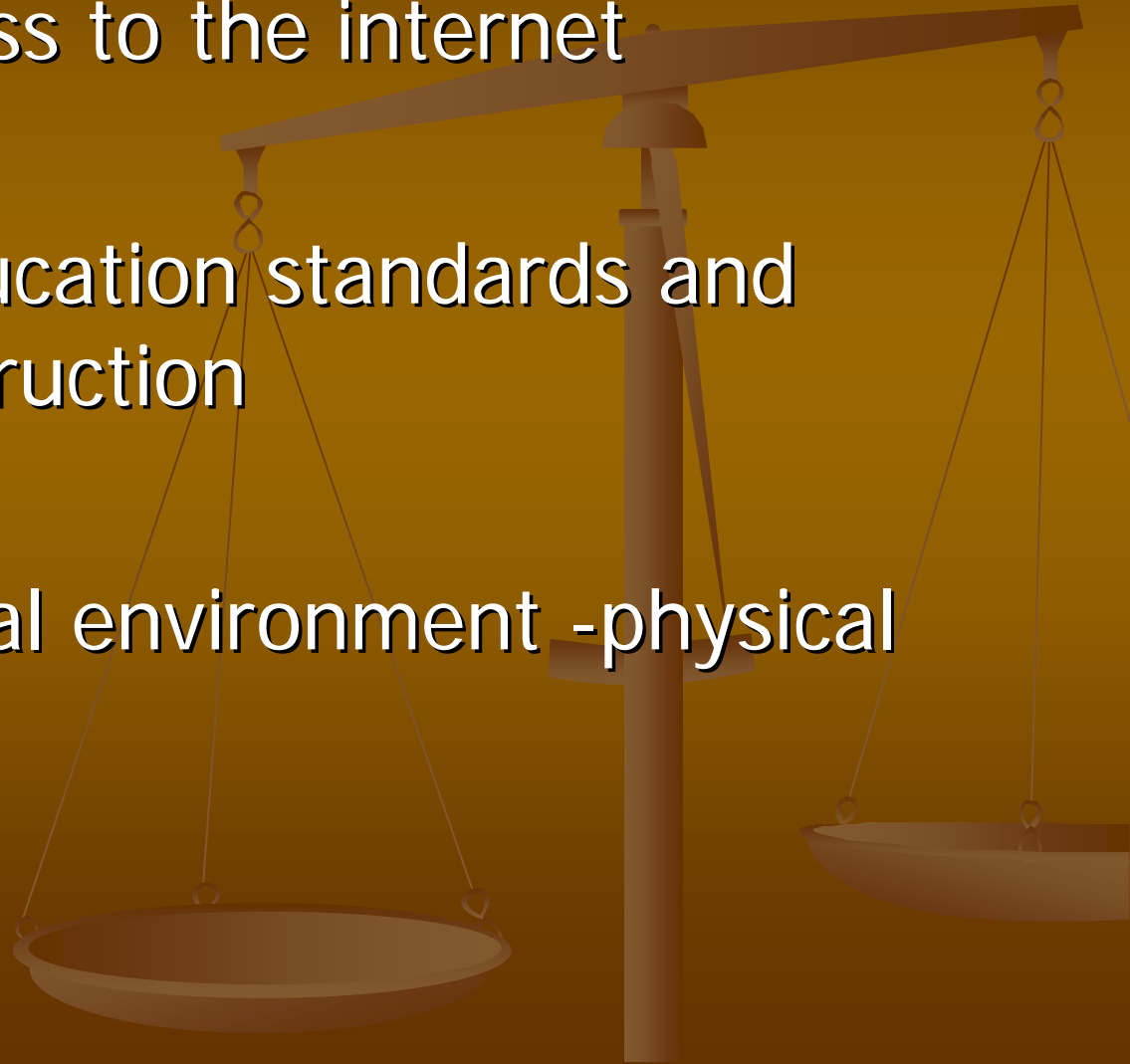


Reflections on Current Challenges

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Current Challenges-Cont'd

Lack of any practice standards in the clinical setting

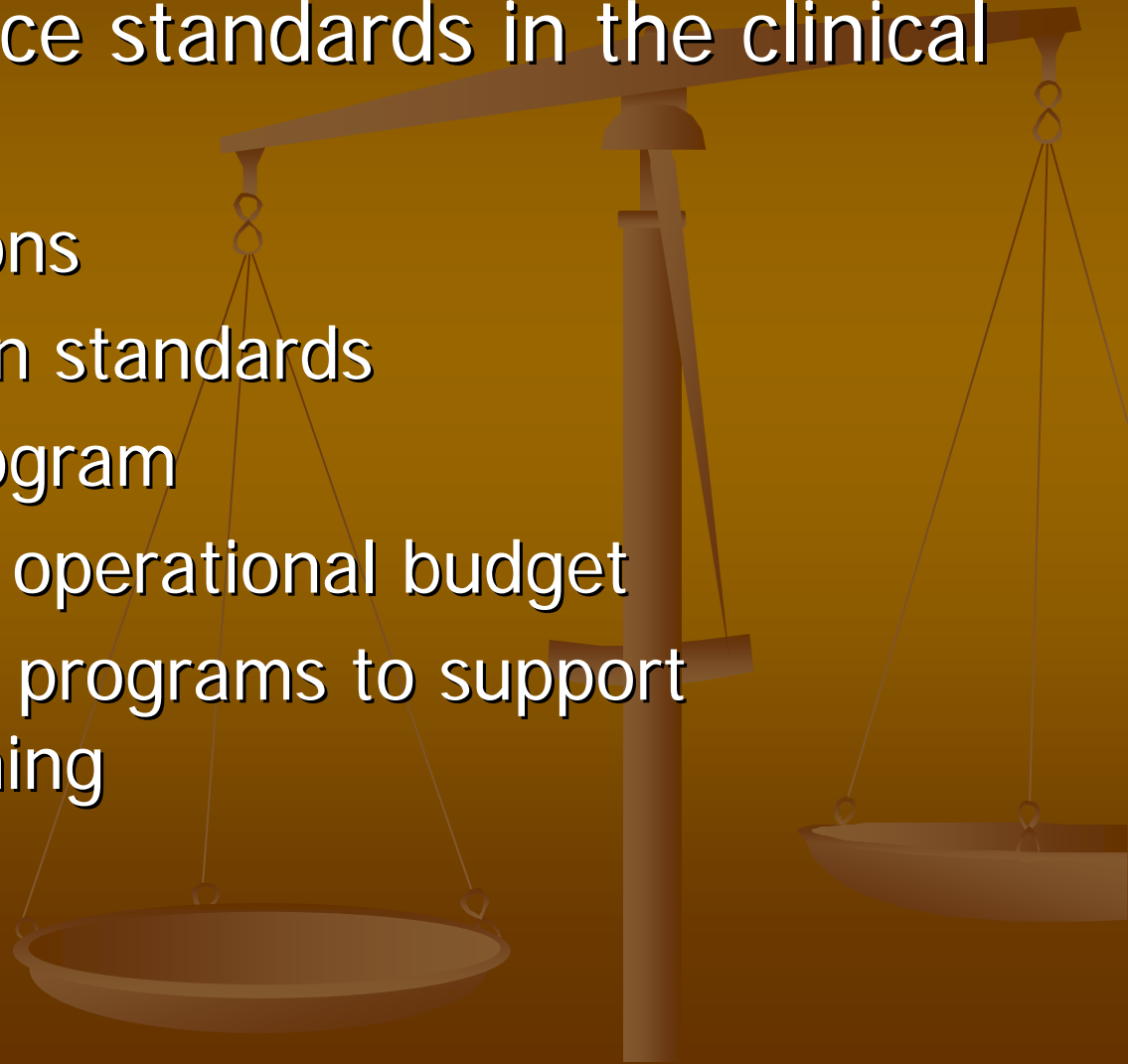
Limited medications

No documentation standards

No structured program

Lack of access to operational budget

Absence of social programs to support discharge planning

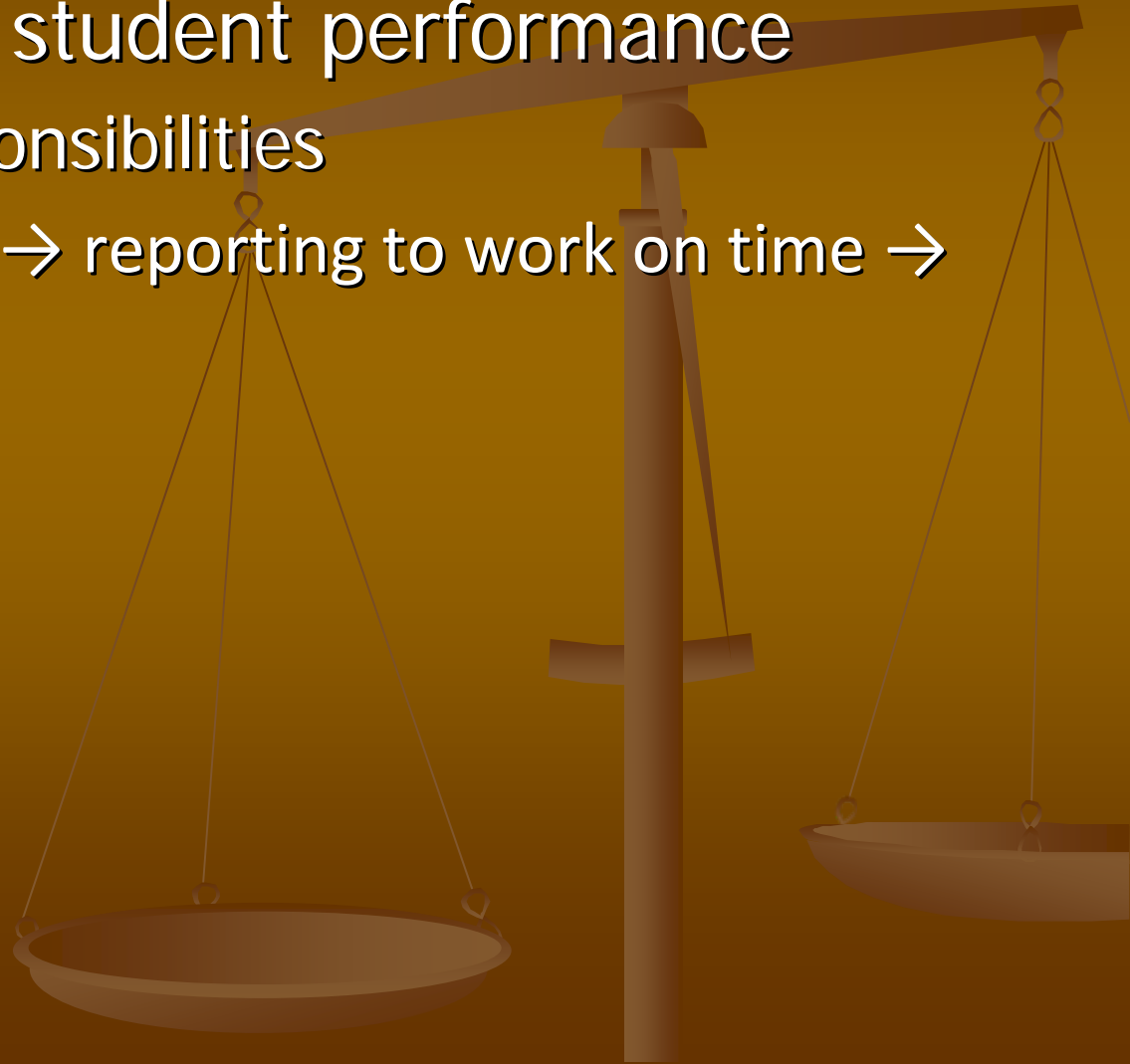


Current Challenges-Cont'd

Social impacts on student performance

Many family responsibilities

Travel challenges → reporting to work on time → professionalism



Successes

Increased in knowledge and skills

Improved patient care

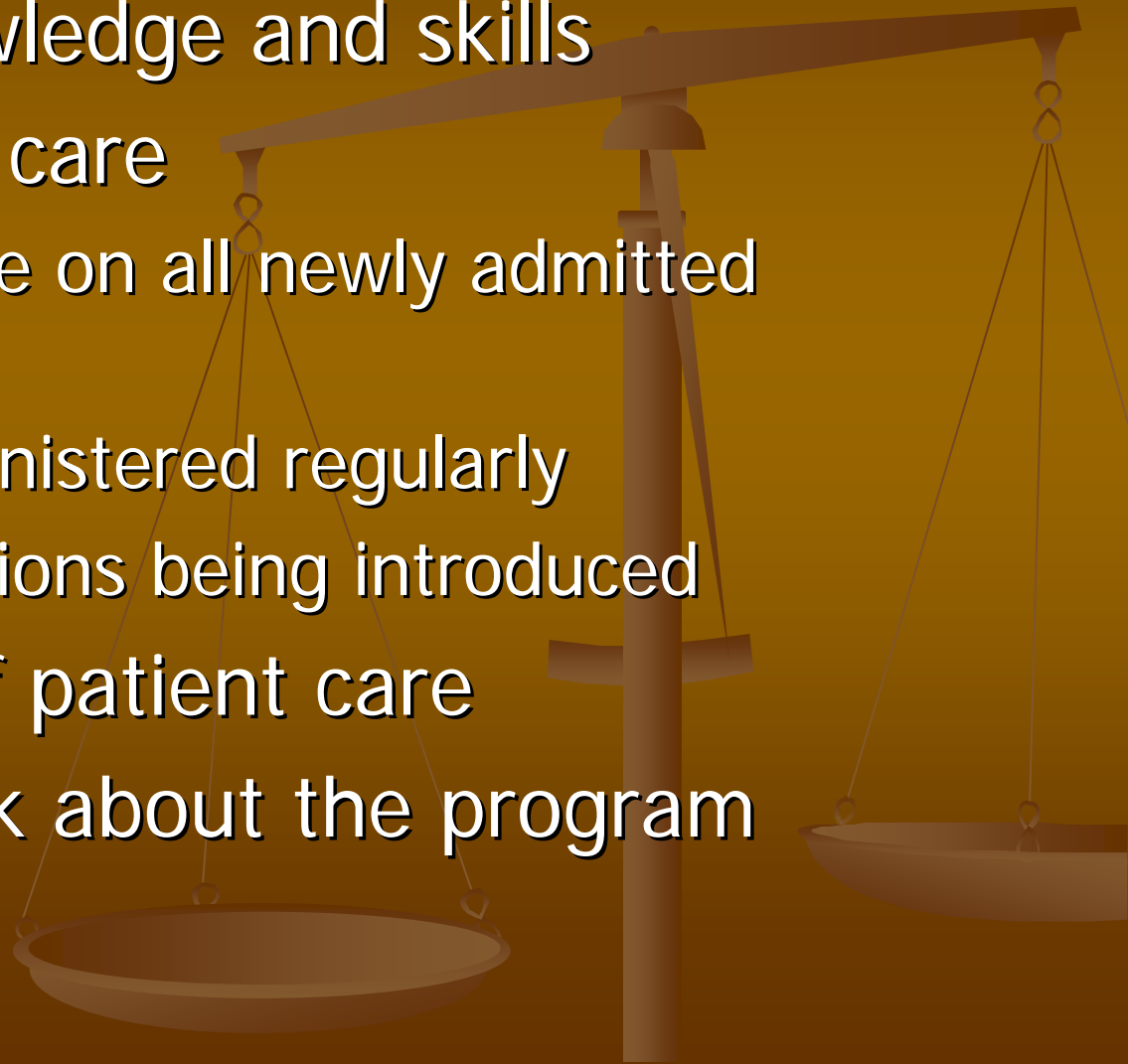
Assessments done on all newly admitted patients

Medications administered regularly
